

## DECISION BT 41/2014

Subject: Withdrawal of CWAs – Follow up to BT 25/2013

BT/TCMG, on behalf of BT,

- noting,
  - Decision BT 25/2013 related to the lifetime of CWAs;
  - that the NSBs holding the secretariat of the Workshops that developed the CWAs were consulted and that the CWAs were not financed by the European Commission;
  - the fundamental disagreement with related comments on draft BT C 50/2014 (BT N 9579) and consequent discussions at the 50th TCMG;
- decides to withdraw the following CWAs (see BT N 9579):
  - CWA 14087:2000 'European Call Centre Standards for Training and Qualification - Customer Contact Representative Competences';
  - CWA 15145:2004 'Automotive fuels - Water in diesel fuel emulsions for use in internal combustion engines - Requirements and test methods';
  - CWA 15375:2005 'Separators for marine residual fuel - Performance testing using specific test oil';
  - CWA 15537:2006 'Network Enabled Abilities - Service-Oriented Architecture for civilian and military crisis management';
  - CWA 15693:2007 'Saving lifetimes of Energy Efficiency Improvement Measures in bottom-up calculations' ;
  - CWA 15847:2008 'Innovation, Coordination and Collaboration in Service Driven Manufacturing Supply Chains - Reference Model for Industrial Services';
  - CWA 15554:2006 'Specifications for a Web Accessibility Conformity Assessment Scheme and a Web Accessibility Quality Mark';
  - CWA 15899:2008 'Standardization of an Innovation Capability Rating for SMEs;
- agrees to maintain CWA 15897:2008 'Submerged Membrane Bioreactor (MBR) Technology', pending the publication of the corresponding CEN/TR by CEN/TC 165 'Waste water engineering';
- agrees that, where it is confirmed that a CWA is intended to be converted into another deliverable, the CWA is kept into existence until the publication of that deliverable upon which the CWA is to be withdrawn.
